Jessica Malay is a Professor of English Literature at the University of Huddersfield, who has published widely on women's writing. After training at St Hild's College, Mirfield she was ordained deacon in 2018. It was during this training that she

first encountered Evelyn Underhill, whom she wrote about during her MA work. She is presently completing an journal article on Evelyn Underhill and her contribution to the Social Christian movement.

She is originally from the Pacific Northwest, near Seattle and studied English literature at St Martin's University, in Olympia Washington, later doing two master's degrees and a PhD in the UK where she has been a long time resident. She has long studied the wit and wisdom of women, and has found the work of Evelyn Underhill to inspire her both as a writer and as a Christian.
